Beta Mu Chapter of Kappa, Kappa, Kappa, has **TWO SCHOLARSHIPS** available for students seeking post-secondary education. The scholarships are:

1. Kappa, Kappa, Kappa \$2,000.00 Scholarship. Awarded to a student seeking a baccalaureate degree at any accredited college or university in the United States. The scholarship is divided equally over 4 years.
2. Kappa, Kappa, Kappa, \$500.00 Scholarship. Awarded to a student seeking an associate degree or diploma at an accredited vocational, technical or two-year college.

TO BE ELIGIBLE APPLICANT MUST:

1. Be a United States citizen and an Indiana resident living within Fulton County.
2. Be a graduating high school senior enrolling in an accredited post-secondary college, university, vocational or trade school as a full-time (as determined by school) student.
3. Be of high moral character and show potential as a student within the chosen field.
4. Submit a complete application by the deadline to the RHS Guidance Office. **The application will be declared ineligible if late or not complete.**
5. Sign a Kappa, Kappa, Kappa Scholarship Agreement and the School Records Release Statement. *The scholarship chairman will obtain signatures after the recipient accepts the scholarship.

TO COMPLETE APPLICATION FOR EITHER SCHOLARSHIP INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING:

An information page LISTING IN ORDER:

1. Your name, age, home address, marital status.
2. Name of high school and graduation date, rank in class, achievement test scores.
3. Name of post-secondary school along with enrollment date and address, area of study you will pursue.
4. Parent's or guardian's name along with their place(s) of employment and highest education attainment, names of other members of the family, in school or college.
5. Places where you have worked, extra curricular activities and special interest and specific information concerning any honors, awards and offices held.
6. Submit an estimated annual cost of tuition, room & board, and textbooks. If you are planning to commute, include cost of transportation. Indicate how you plan to meet the cost of school. List any other scholarship for which you are making application.

7. Transcript of grades (7 semesters).
8. Three letters of recommendations from teachers, employers or persons in the community who know you well.
9. Submit a career goal statement in 300 words or less. Be clear, concise and realistic.
10. Additional information you want the committee to know about you.

Your application will be carefully studied and evaluated in confidence by the scholarship committee. Applications must be submitted to the RHS Guidance office by 3:00 p.m. on February 23, 2018.
